We tried a different venue for our 2014 St. Georges Day event, in the field opposite Markstakes Corner, and what an outstanding success and inspired decision that was. Plenty of room, excellent drainage and easy to see from the road. The event was well supported and because of the excellent location a lot of passers-by popped in as well.

Following the success of the New Field it got us thinking about Bonfire Night and what if we held that there as well. It would give us more space and the ditch would provide a natural barrier between the Firing and Public Areas, the fire could also appear more accessible while still being safe.

BONFIRE PREPARATION: TORCHMAKING



Each year, Chailey Bonfire Society has to manufacturer from offcuts of wood, hessian sacks, old jeans from the Jumble Sales and contaminated diesel the torches we use on Bonfire Night and Badge Night.

We staple the hessian and jeans to the stick, then tightly wind until it is tight, then use wire to complete the torch head.
