Your Society is responsible for You, Your Marshalls, Your insurance and Your welfare. Please listen closely to Your Marshalls advice during the Procession

- Outfits should be fire-proofed, either with a proprietary product or borax mixture
- Our route is approx 2 miles, with 3 stops
- Please wear appropriate footwear
- You should march in ranks of three
- All children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult
- If you have more than one child with you, put them in the rank in front of you where you can see them at all times
- Torches may only be carried by persons over the age of 16
- Torches must only be lit when directed by the procession leader
- Spent torches are to be dropped in the gutter
- Centre ranks should drop torches between the centre and the outside ranks
- Torches will be doused at the entrance to the firesite
- Wreathes from visiting Societies and Organisations are welcome at the Chailey War Memorial during our celebrations
- The throwing / use of any type of firework is strictly prohibited at Chailey Bonfire Celebrations
- The use of sparklers or 'throwdowns' is strictly prohibited at Chailey Bonfire Celebrations
- Please help us respect Chailey's Fallen by being silent during the Minutes Silence

We expect everyone present to be tolerant of and respectful to all fellow members regardless of colour/creed/religious ideas or lifestyles.

If you are seen not following these Written Safety Rules and Advice you will either be given a warning or asked to leave.
